

We like to link to the three Cs (character, colour, camera) and Ss (story, sound and setting) – we use these with young audiences to help explore key aspects of moving image creation. We've used these activity sheets with family groups, nurseries, public workshops and school visits as well as having them available to pick up from our venue and online.

These activity sheets are designed to fit on A4 or A3 for photocopying or downloading at home, and can be done using simple materials.


Pufferfish Face

Use the materials provided OR whatever you have at home to turn this outline below into a real character...










A Party for Alfred!

You can draw, colour in or cut and stick collage to make your party scene below










Help Boris Bake!

We'd like you to use your imagination to show how water gets to where you live...

My Imaginary Friend


In the beautiful animated film, *Lulina e a Lua*, the filmmakers take us into the amazing world of Lulina's imagination and her fears. She creates and meets an imaginary friend as she goes on a journey to find out that her fears are not as bad as she imagined they were after all.



We'd like you to create your own imaginary friend. What would they look like, what textures, colours, shapes would they have? Where would they take you?

Whilst you are doing this in your family group have a chat about when you were very little, what you were afraid of and how things have changed as you have grown up.
